## What is the IB Middle Years Programme (MYP)?

The MYP is designed for students aged $\mathbf{1 1}$ to $\mathbf{1 6}$. It provides a framework of learning that encourages students to become creative, critical and reflective thinkers. MYP emphasizes intellectual challenge and encouraging students to make connections between their studies in traditional subjects and the real world. It also fosters the development of skills for communication, intercultural understanding and global engagement which are essential qualities for young people who are becoming global leaders.

## Benefits of IB Middle Years Programme (MYP):

- Nurtures students holistically by attending to their intellectual, social, emotional, and physical well-being.
- Offers opportunities for students to cultivate the knowledge, attitudes, and skills necessary to navigate complexity and assume responsible roles in shaping the future.
- Enables a comprehensive understanding through the exploration of eight subject groups.
- Mandates the study of at least two languages, including the language of instruction and an additional language of choice, fostering an appreciation for one's culture and an understanding of others.
- Empowers students to engage in community service, promoting a sense of responsibility and active participation.
- Facilitates readiness for further education, the workforce, and a lifelong commitment to learning.

## What is the IB Diploma Programme?

The IB Diploma Programme is an academically challenging and balanced programme of education, with final examinations, that prepares students aged $\mathbf{1 6}$ to $\mathbf{1 9}$ for success at university and in life beyond. It has been designed to address the intellectual, social, emotional and physical well-being of students. The programme has gained recognition and respect from the world's leading universities.
-Students in the DP program are required to select a course from each of the six subject groups, ensuring a comprehensive grasp of language and literature, individuals and societies, the sciences, and mathematics. Additionally, students must decide between taking an arts course from the arts group or opting for a second course from any of the remaining subject groups. This approach encourages a well-rounded and diverse academic experience.


## Standard level (SL)

- 150 Teaching Hourse


## High Level (HL)

- At least 3, not more than 4 HL Course
- 240 Teaching hours
-Students can study and take examinations in English, French or Spanish.
Two courses are classified as interdisciplinary, meaning that they need to satisfy the requirements of more than one subject group.
- Literature and performance (studies in language and literature subject group and the arts subject group)
- Environmental systems and societies (individuals and societies subject group and sciences subject group)
